#### DEADLINES

Projects will always have a due date listed on the grading rubric handouts and the LMS. Late work drops 5 points a day. Please communicate difficulties/emergencies with me as needs arise.

#### ATTENDANCE

Absences and tardiness interfere with your learning and success. Be here, on time. Absences are excused by a note or phone call from a parent to the attendance office. Late work due to unexcused absences will not be excused. If absent, it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to find out what you missed and make it up ASAP. Daily points are given for participation and effort. Please work in class so you do not have homework! In May, students will have an Art Exhibition for their works of art created through the year. # ART CLUB



Art Club is for students (grades 7-12) who are interested in the arts. Students do not need to be enrolled in an art class, but all students enrolled in a 9-12 Art class get to be members. Art Class students that wish to not be active members still receive the extra benefits Art Club receives; such as submission to Holiday Crafts, Art Shows, Artist in Spotlight, Awards, and Field Trips.

Art club is a great organization. The club provides students with hands-on projects and a place to talk about what is happening in the art world. We not only have planned field trips to local universities, events, galleries, and museums, but also organize various Educational Tours around the world! In Art Club we do monthly studio days: consisting of projects, parent's night, field trips, and guest artists. Studio Time (M-Th 3:20-4) is set aside in the Art room to work on semester and contest projects. Outstanding and hardworking artists will also be honored seasonally with our Artist in Spotlight award. Artist are interviewed for the newsletter which is displayed at the school,

in the Larimore Leader, and sent home to parents.

Being affiliated with National Art Honor Society is an amazing opportunity for artists. This program inspires and recognizes students with an outstanding ability and keen interest in the visual arts. To be eligible to be a member of NAHS artists need to meet the criteria detailed in the NAHS Constitution and LHS Art Club bylaws. Students gain peer recognition and leadership growth opportunities that support college preparation and opportunities for awards, scholarships, and to have work published nationally. In the Fall LHS publicly recognizes members at our community wide Induction Ceremony.



All events and opportunities are ranked on an earned point system. Artists will fill out online the events they participated and the Secretary records and tallies the points. If the artist has reached 250 points, participate in fundraisers, and submitted the two works of art, they will receive an Art Club Letter and NAHS certification! They are also then eligible to receive awards at Night of the Arts.

# BYLAWS

To letter in Art Club and receive certification in NAHS, members must be active and fulfill all the section bylaw requirements listed below.

#### Section 1: MEMBERSHIP

- o All Art Class Students grades 9-12 get to be in Art Club.
- o Active or Inactive
  - Art Students can choose to be an Active or Inactive Art Club member. This will effect lettering and participation status. See Section 4
  - Art Class students who wish to not be an active member must still register for Art Club.

#### Section 2: NAHS

- o Students MUST maintain a 2.7 GPA to be inducted/honored.
- o Seniors receiving the NAHS Honor Cord, to be worn over the graduation gown, also must earn the 2.7 GPA throughout high school.
- o To complete this honor, artists must fulfill Art Club lettering requirements.
- o Artists do not have to be an honors student to be in Art Club\*\*\*
- o Scholarships and awards are available in NAHS. Please ask your officers and look on the NAHS website.
- o The school wide induction ceremony will be held in April for all students that have fulfilled Art Club Bi-Laws.

#### Section 5: CLVB POINTS:

- o If artists are attending Art Tours and fundraising for their trips the money AFTER the minimum amount will go directly toward their trip.

#### ART TOURS

Every two years the Art Department will give students the opportunity to travel on an Educational Tour around the world. Trips will be presented two years prior to the event in September/October. A parent meeting will be arranged and all information will be presented at that time.

#### OFFICERS

In the Spring the selection of officers to this chapter of Art Club and National Art Honor Society shall be recommended by chapter sponsor and presiding officers and bylaws. A majority of votes shall be necessary to elect any officer of this chapter. The following are the elected positions:

- PRESIDENT STROMBERG- the president presides over all meetings, is responsible for organizing and coordinating all activities and events. You work closely with the Public Relations Officer in helping complete all advertising (newsletter, photography, locker posters, etc.)
- SECRETARY CRONIN- Takes roll at all meetings and records on file the minutes at all the meetings, types meetings so they may be posted on the art club website, collects and keeps accurate records of dues, monies, and club points. You are in charge on communicating monthly to your members about their club status.
- PUBLIC RELATIONS WELTE- This officer is a very social person in charge of spreading the word about art club events to the community. This person is considered a true representation of what an Owl represents. Your duty is to maintain a record of chapter achievements and promote excellence through highlighting activities, events and accomplishments so that our chapter membership is motivated by our past successes and looks to future achievements. You will take pictures at all events to post on social media & websites. You are in charge of downloading projects, events, etc on the art club website, instagram, facebook, & twitter. You make the posters, postcards, & flyers for all events (must be done 2 weeks before day of event). The Secretary and PR constructs a seasonal newsletter (Sept, Dec, March) to send out to members.

### ART DEPARTMENT CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

1/2 CREDIT PER SEMESTER LIMIT OF 15 PER CLASS PERIOD

The arts are vital to our culture so I believe all individuals in our communities should experience all types of art. The arts extend human experiences and make us aware of who we are and what we believe. A work of art presents thoughts, feelings, and perceptions for our contemplation. The arts deal with the uniqueness of each individual and the glorification of one's being and creative imagination. Without the arts there would be no architecture, no music, no dance, no theater, no fashion, no painting or sculpture, no landscaping, and no beauty. One could not imagine life without the arts.

#### BENEFITS

- Stimulates and develops the imagination and critical thinking, and refines cognitive and creative skills.
- Has a tremendous impact on the developmental growth of every child and has proven to help level the "learning field" across socio-economic boundaries.
- Strengthens problem-solving and critical-thinking skills, adding to overall academic achievement and school success.
- Develops a sense of craftsmanship, quality task performance, and goal-setting—skills needed to succeed in the classroom and beyond.
- Teaches children life skills such as developing an informed perception; articulating a vision; learning to solve problems and make decisions; building self-confidence and self-discipline; developing the ability to imagine what might be; and accepting responsibility to complete tasks from start to finish.
- Nurtures important values, including team-building skills; respecting alternative viewpoints; and appreciating and being aware of different cultures and traditions.
- Plays a central role in cognitive, motor, language, and social-emotional development.
- Motivates and engages children in learning, stimulates memory, facilitates understanding, enhances symbolic communication, promotes relationships, and provides an avenue for building competence.
- Provides a natural source of learning. Child development specialists note that play is the business of young children; play is the way children promote and enhance their development. The arts are a most natural vehicle for play.

#### JH ART- INTRODUCTION TO VISUAL ARTS Grade 7

Introduction to Visual Arts is designed to introduce basic art concepts and techniques. Students will explore the use of a variety of drawing and painting materials including: pencil, colored pencil, pen and ink, pastels, water color, tempera and acrylic. Related projects will be assigned to help develop technical competency in these areas. Students also explore two and three dimensional art forms in clay, paper mache, fibers, and mixed media materials. Art appreciation and understanding is integrated within the curriculum to introduce student to the value and importance of art throughout history and our daily lives.

### JH ART- ART CONCEPTS & TECHNIQUES

Grade 8

Art Concepts & Techniques is designed to focus more closely on basic art concepts and techniques. Students will explore the use of a variety of components, fundamentals, and history. In addition, a variety of mediums will be used; pencil, colored pencil, fibers, ceramics, and painting. Related projects will be assigned to help develop technical competency in all these areas, including basic design and exploration in two and three-dimensional art forms. Some of these great projects are self-portraits, landscapes, famous replicas, holiday crafts, and culinary projects.

## ART I- DRAWING & PAINTING

Grades 9-12

Drawing and Painting are fundamental courses that will address basic art and design skills in drawing and painting composition, as well as principles of two-dimensional art. Art I/II is designed to continue the study of art concepts and techniques covered in Junior High Art at a developed level. Introducing concepts and methods of artistic design & critique.

#### ART II- WORLD OF ART

Grades 10-12

Prerequisite: Art 1

World of Art is designed to focus more closely on art concepts and techniques. Students will explore the use of a variety of components and fundamentals through history. In addition, a variety of mediums will be used; pencil, colored pencil, fibers, ceramics, and painting. Related projects will be assigned to help develop technical competency in all these areas, including basic design and exploration in two and three-dimensional art forms. Some of these great projects are self-portraits, landscapes, famous replicas, holiday crafts, and culinary projects.

#### ART III- STUDIO ART

Grades 10-12

Prerequisite: Art I, II

Studio Art artists will explore their interests and decide on a theme that best describes not only their talents, but themselves. Through this theme the artist will independently compile at least 8 pieces of work in multiple mediums. Upon completion of their works, an artist statement is written. Taking what they have learned throughout their artistic education, as an artist they will be able to display their work through an Art Exhibition during our year end Night of the Arts. Artists will be in the limelight as they will be able to show the community their talents.

#### ART IV- DUAL CREDIT ART 110

Grades 11-12 Prerequisite: Art I, II

Dual Credit Art 110 is a college level class through Valley City State University. Students will receive high school and college credit at the same time! This is a General Education credit that is University transferable. The credits are offered at a reduced price of \$210 for 3 credits, instead of \$750 when taken in college. Art is a part of General Education requirements, so it's a great opportunity to get the credits at a great price and done in high school! Art 110 is a Studio Art class which gives students the opportunity to be an artist with art history integration.

#### ART CLUB

Grades 7-12

Art Club is for students who are interested in the arts; they do not need to be enrolled in an art class. In Art Club, we do monthly craft days, murals, making items for holiday events, art contests, culinary experiences, and our own awesome Spring Night of the Arts! We elect officers including President, Vice-President, Secretary/Photographer, & Public Relations. Art club is a great organization. The club provides students with hands-on projects and a place to talk about what is happening in the art world. We not only have planned field trips to local events, galleries, and museums, but also coordinate the Fine Arts for various Tours around the world. See Art Club Contract for Bi-Laws.

#### ART EDUCATIONAL TOURS

Traveling with the school art department is a once in a lifetime opportunity! Many adults don't get the opportunity to travel Nationally or Internationally. Many students don't get to travel the way your child will. He/She will be learning before, during and after the trip, this is an educational journey, not a vacation. As an introduction to international Art and Careers, your child will participate in an elective as well as complete academic work on the trip, all while having fun! In Art your child studies many styles of art and famous artists and this is the best way to experience firsthand what has been learned in class. Students learn best through experiences and this experience will develop their creative minds. Travel can also develop your child's self-esteem, help him/her learn independence, learn how to manage time and money effectively, teach him/her how to set goals and work hard for something he/she wants. Your child will also learn how to increase and maintain good academic performance. Our goal is to develop unique annual fundraisers to not only reach our financial aspect, but to display what the students have learned.
